Kerr's first foray into business was as founder of KORA Organics, a certified organic skincare line that's now sold around the world. She has also collaborated with established brands such as Royal Albert and Mother denim, but it's her new line with Universal Furniture that has the design world buzzing. "As someone who loves the sanctuary of home, it has always been a dream of mine to create my own collection of furniture," says Kerr. The line, called Love.Joy.Bliss., covers the whole home with nearly 50 different pieces. Created with contemporary lines, the furnishings feature pastel colors, nubby fabrics and soft-gold hardware. "Miranda had a vision for what she hoped to achieve with this collection based on her career in fashion and her travels around the world," says Universal Furniture Director of Marketing Neil MacKenzie. "We are both really pleased with the end result." As befits Kerr's positive energy, many pieces have a hidden written affirmation (hint: look in the drawers), which is almost as lovely as the designs themselves.
